I. WHAT IS STUDENT ENGAGEMENT AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

One of the earliest theories of engagement was the participation-identification model (Finn 1989). This theory defines engagement in school as "having both a behavioral component, termed participation, and an emotional component, termed identification [emphasis in original]" (Finn and Voelkl 1993, p. 249).

The concept of student engagement typically arises when educators discuss or prioritize educational strategies and teaching techniques that address the developmental, intellectual, emotional, behavioral, physical, and social factors that either enhance or undermine learning for students.
